SUNDAY JULY 20, 2025

Newport, Oregon - Airplanes
- Wine - Lighthouses

Celebrate the wonder of man-made flight during a tour of the **Evergreen Aviation Museum**. The museum displays several military and civilian aircraft and spacecraft, most notably, the Hughes H-4 Hercules, popularly known as the Spruce Goose. Then, enjoy our first of several wine tasting experiences of the Pacific



Northwest in Oregon's famed **Willamette Valley Wine Country**. This afternoon we'll visit the **Yaquina Bay Lighthouse**. Built in 1871, it is believed to be the oldest structure in the Newport, Oregon area and the only existing wooden Oregon lighthouse still standing. Then, we arrive in another of the "Emeralds of the Pacific Northwest" - **Newport, OR**, a coastal playground nestled between the mountains, Pacific Ocean and Yaquina Bay with its wondrous natural beauty and impressive fishing fleet. After checking into our hotel for the next two nights, we enjoy dinner at one of the local fresh seafood restaurants. **(BD)**

DAY # 3

MONDAY JULY 21, 2025

Newport, Oregon - Marine
Cruise - Sand Dune Buggy
Ride

The sun-worshipping seals of Newport Harbor take center stage this morning as we join an expert Local Specialist onboard a **Nature Cruise** to spot the sea life and marine birds that find sanctuary amongst these waters. Next incomparable scenery surrounds us on the drive along the rugged edge of the Oregon coast. This stretch of breathless coastline is marked by steep headlands, jagged volcanic outcrops, and spectacular scenery. Turn in any direction for striking views that will surprise and amaze you! We'll visit the

"**EMERALD'S**", **Oregon Dunes National Recreation Area**, the largest expanse of coastal sand dunes in North America extending for 40 miles along the coast -- the wind-sculpted dunes stretch approximately 500 feet above sea level. Enjoy the ride on a special **Dune Buggy** that takes you through this wild and untamed region. Tonight, opt to explore Newport's bay-front area with its plethora of shops, art galleries, chowder houses, and seafood restaurants housed in turn of the century storefronts. **(B)**

Portland, Oregon Tillamook
Cheese - Coastal Beaches

The spectacular Oregon coastline continues as we travel north along the scenic highway 101 with several picture stops along the way. We will visit the nationally recognized **Tillamook Cheese** factory and a self-guided tour of the facility. Be sure to sample their award-winning cheese and the opportunity to purchase the products. Next, we visit "**EMERALD'S, Cannon Beach**", noted by National Geographic as one of the 100 most

beautiful places in the world! The first recorded journey by an American to what is now Cannon Beach was made by William Clark, one of the leaders of the Lewis and Clark Expedition in early 1805. After checking into our hotel to freshen up, we'll enjoy a reception and dinner. **(BD)**

DAY # 5

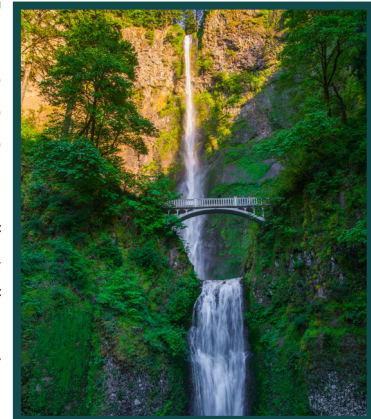
WEDNESDAY JULY 23, 2025

Portland Oregon - Mt Hood
- Hood River Orchard -
Hatchery - Multnomah Falls

Today we travel into the "**Emeralds of the Pacific Northwest**" - **Cascade Mountain Range** and majestic Mt. Hood. Along the way we'll visit remnants of the **Oregon Trail and Toll Gates** of the time. Enjoy an included lunch at Mt. Hood Mountain's **Timberline Lodge**. There will be free time to ride the chair lifts (on your own subject to weather) from our 6,000-foot base

camp to the next ski level for spectacular views of the mountain range. Then, we descend from the mountain into the **Hood River Valley** to visit an **Orchard** for sampling of the variety of fruits that are produced in the valley. Our next stop will be the **Columbia River Fish Hatchery** to learn about the life cycle of Salmon and an opportunity to view the giant sturgeons of the **Columbia River**. Following the mighty Columbia River, our final stop will be the beautiful **Multnomah Falls**. Higher than Niagara Falls, it is the perfect photo opportunity to end a most enjoyable day. **(BL)**

After arriving in the **"Emerald City of Seattle"**, enjoy lunch (on your own) and time to explore the many shops and restaurants along the bustling waterfront and wharf. This afternoon we have a narrated **Cruise on Puget Sound** with spectacular views of the Seattle Skyline. After

checking into our downtown Seattle hotel, you are free to explore the many fine bistros, restaurants, and attractions of the city. **(B)**

FRIDAY JULY 25, 2025

Seattle, Washington - Boeing
Factory Tour - Chihuly Glass
Exhibit - Space Needle - Dinner
on the Wharf

We travel to Everett, Washington for a special tour of the **Boeing Air-Craft Company**. This facility has the world's largest building on the planet by volume and produces a variety of aviation products besides aircraft. There will be time to explore the gift shop and aerospace exhibits after our tour. We return to Seattle, Washington, and visit the **Chihuly Glass Exhibit** located at the Seattle Center. This 1.5-acre facility encompasses a theater, gardens, gift shop

and the glass design exhibits of Dale Chihuly one of America's great glass sculptures. The 605 ft **Space Needle** is also located at Seattle Center and considered the icon of the city when it was constructed for the 1962 World's Fair. We will take the elevator, in just 41 seconds, to the 520 foot observation level for panoramic views of the city, Mt Rainer and the Cascade/Olympic Mountains. The remainder of the afternoon is free to explore the Seattle Aquarium or maybe the unique shops and antique malls along the wharf. This evening, we enjoy dinner at one of Seattle's fine restaurants. **(BD)**
